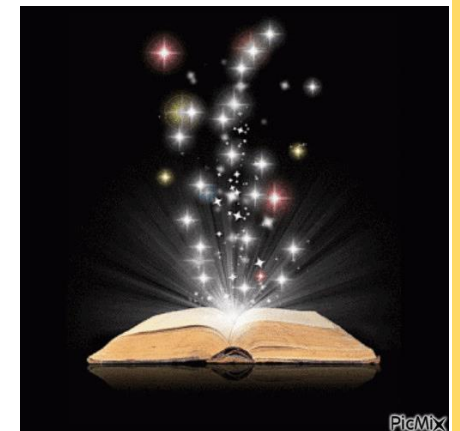
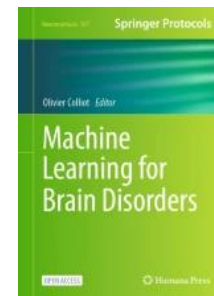
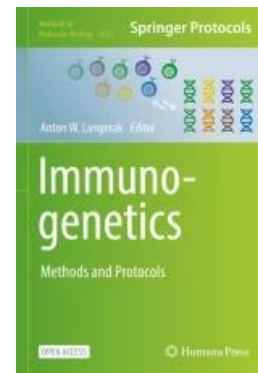
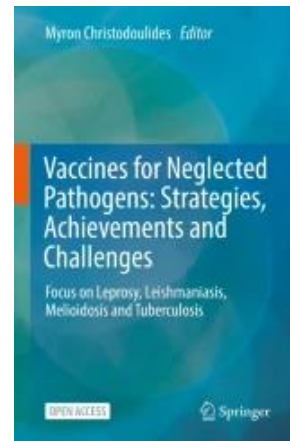
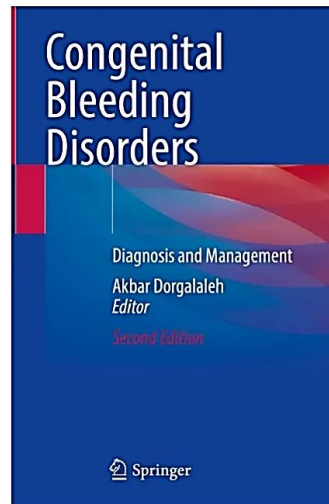
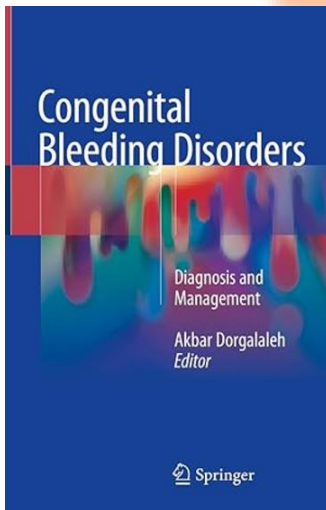


Introduction

Publishing a book is a significant milestone in a researcher's career, and can increase your visibility, credibility, and recognition.

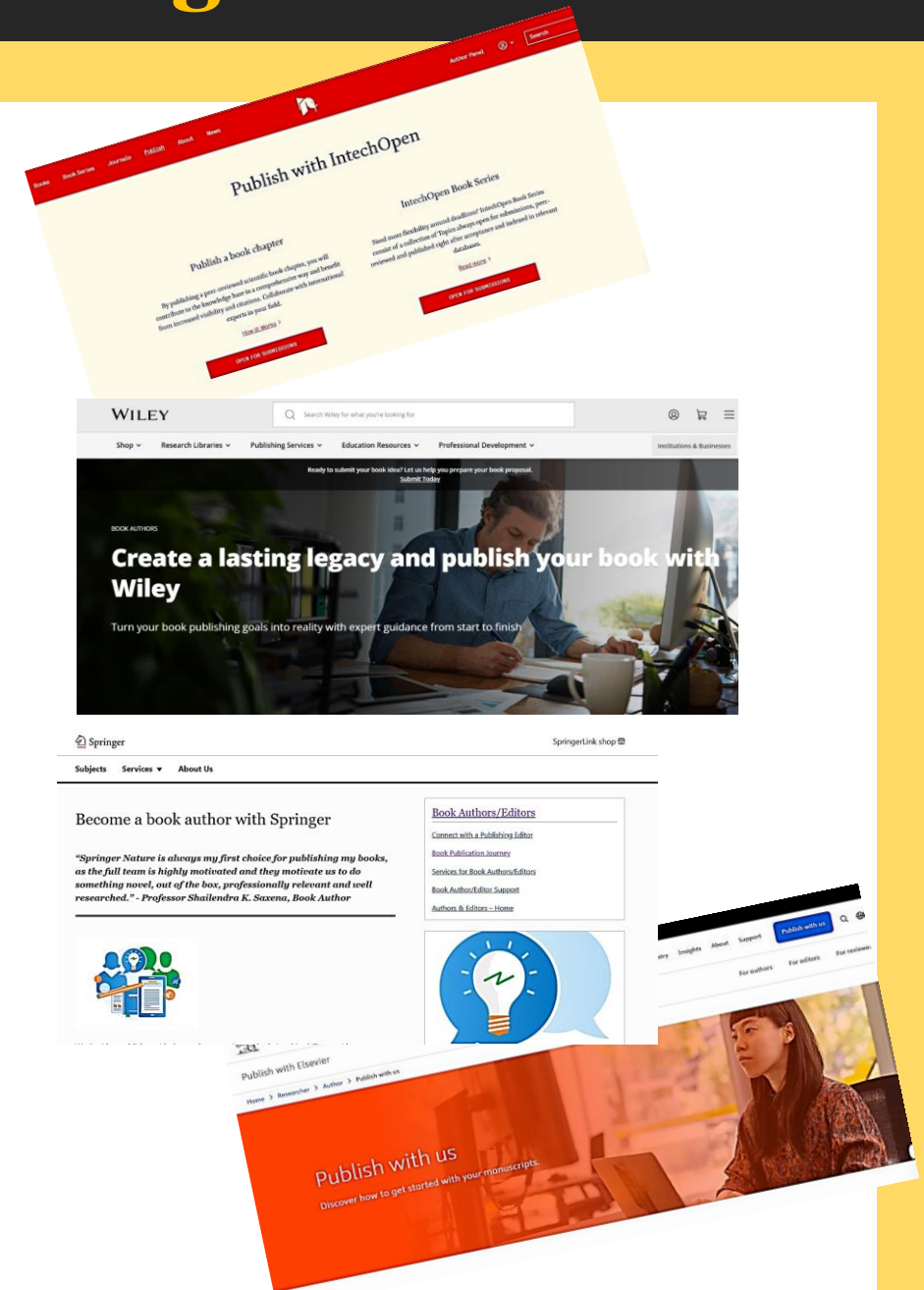
The most important consideration in deciding whether to write a book is whether there is a need—a market—for it.

Contributing to a book chapter has benefits similar to writing a book. If you are well-known in your field you may be directly invited to write a chapter for a planned book.

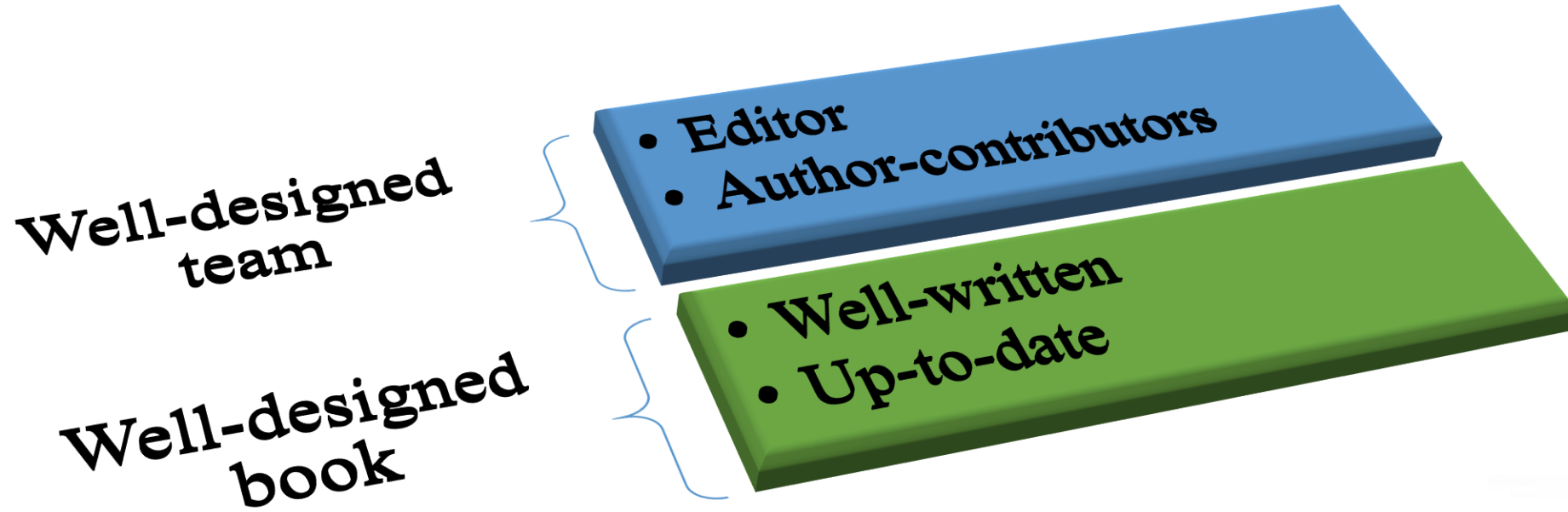


Step-by-step guide to book publishing

Writing Process



Writing a Proposal

Need: Critically examine all the published books that cover the same or closely-related topics.

Market: Will your book be written for specialists in a certain field, or will it interest a broader range of researchers? Does it have the potential to be used as a textbook

Plan: This includes a proposed title and table of contents for your book, and estimates of how long each section will be and how long it will take to complete the book.

Contributors: Who are the book's authors and editors, and what are their backgrounds?
